1. Mr. Salil Ch Karmakar of Barrackpore joined association as a new Life Member in 2021
2. A new website was launched as 'kkckol.org.in'. A short film was produced to highlight genesis of the association, its aims and objectives. The film was uploaded in the website of the association and also in you tube. The association has now face book, instagram and Twitter accounts.
3. In view of the then surge in Covid infection association appealed to its members and well wishers to donate for buying at least two Oxygen Concentrators to hand over to Haringhata block for the use of suffering patients free of cost. Overwhelming response to the appeal enabled us to buy and hand over 2 concentrators to the block on May 28, 2021. Block officials kindly agreed to reach them to the ailing patients. A third concentrator was also bought and placed at the registered office for use of the people in the neighbourhood.
4. Later further donations were raised to arrange for vaccination with first dose of Covishield to 100 people of Madhyamgram free of cost. Madhyamgram Association for Social Service (MASS) collaborated in this effort. Vaccination was done at 'Surakshya Clinic' of Madhyamgram on payment by the association.
5. Association has constituted its own Ethical Committee to seek ethical clearance of all the projects that it intends to submit to external funding agencies.

Published a previous piece of work by the association in the form of a paper entitled 'Efficacy of Interventional Awareness Program on HIV/AIDS among High School Students of West Bengal, India' in a peer reviewed journal named Journal of the Indian Medical Association, Vol 120, No 2, February 2022 having the authors as Ramdas Chatterjee, Shambo Samrat Samajdar, Shatavisa Mukherjee, Jyotirmoy Pal
